Ac 11:26 And when he had found him, he brought him unto Antioch. And it came to pass, that a whole year they assembled themselves with the church, and taught much people. And the disciples were called Christians first in Antioch.

Barnabas and Saul came to the church at Antioch. Imagine what a difference they made! The Bible says that after a year of teaching the Word of God, the people grew tremendously. It was here in Antioch that disciples were first called Christians. This was a descriptive title given them by the world as they observed their lives. They were known to be like Jesus. ▣ Acts 10:24-48 (Mark if read)

Ac 10:25 *And as Peter was coming in, Cornelius met him, and fell down at his feet, and worshipped him. 26 But Peter took him up, saying, Stand up; I myself also am a man.*

Peter knew well that he was not worthy to have anyone bow down before him! Sometimes we can be guilty of giving "man" more adoration than he deserves. There are good Christian people who love the Lord, but we must remember that the transformation of a life is of the grace of God. It is not of us, but of God. Be careful how you give and receive praise and honor. Jesus Christ alone is worthy. We ought to give honor where honor is due, but we must be careful to deflect praise and thanksgiving to the Lord ultimately.

▣ Acts 9:1-21 (Mark if read)

Ac 9:4 *And he fell to the earth, and heard a voice saying unto him, Saul, Saul, why persecutest thou me?*

Jesus took it PERSONAL that Saul was persecuting His followers. He didn't say, "Why are you persecuting THEM?" HE said, "Why are you persecuting ME? Realize that when you are mistreated, our Lord feels the pain we feel. He will fight our battles and defend us because they are His battles and we are in Him and He in us.

Also realize that if you are one who mistreats God's people, you are mistreating God. Do you mock Christians? Do you belittle or make fun of God's own? You are on the wrong side.

Ac 9:27 But Barnabas took him, and brought him to the apostles, and declared unto them how he had seen the Lord in the way, and that he had spoken to him, and how he had preached boldly at Damascus in the name of Jesus.

Barnabas is known in the Scriptures as being an encourager. His name means "Son of Consolation (which means *comfort, strength, refreshment, and support*). What wonderful descriptive words to characterize an individual. He saw the potential in Saul and realized that God had called him for a special task. He saw the potential in John Mark even when Paul wasn't willing to give him another chance. The church needs Barnabases! Decide today that you will be a Barnabas to your church!

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▣ Acts 10:1-23 (Mark if read)

Ac 10:1 ¶ There was a certain man in Caesarea called Cornelius, a centurion of the band called the Italian band,

The conversion of Cornelius is a wonderful story of the grace of God and a powerful transition of the working of God from the Jews to the Gentiles. The Lord would use this event to change Peter's entire perspective on life as his ministering to people was concerned.

Cornelius was a sincere man, but was not saved. God sending Peter to him shows that anyone sincerely desiring to know the truth, God will reveal Himself to them. Every step we take towards desiring to know God, He takes towards us revealing Himself to us.
